The English-subtitled comedy is about a French taxi driver and bigamist, Jean Martin, who has been successfully married to two

women for 18 years.

However his double-life begins to unravel when romance blossoms between his oblivious teenage son and daughter from separate mothers. Gibert plays Jean's dopey neigh-

bour, Gilbert, who tries to help keep the families a secret from each other.

Gibert said he met his own wife, Anna, through the theatre group.

"I was declaring my love for her on stage every night (as actors), and that's how it started," he said. Gibert said the group kept him in touch with his European roots

and gave non-French people an insight into French drama.

"You will want to come if you have an interest in the French

language, but if you learn it or know it, it's even better," he said. "If your French is a bit shaky
